

PROJECT OVERVIEW




MIDDLEFIELD ROAD

- Repaving scheduled from Moffett to Whisman (2023-2024)
- Potential protected bikeway facilities from Moffett to Bernardo*

MOFFETT BOULEVARD

- Repaving from Middlefield to Clark*
- Protected bikeways planned*
- Sidewalk gap closure near Leong*

* Grant request pending





Planned Conditions




MIDDLEFIELD ROAD

- Bicycle Transportation Plan calls for full-time bike lanes or protected bikeways
- AccessMV identifies this corridor as a high priority

MOFFETT ROAD

- Bicycle Transportation Plan calls for protected bikeways
- AccessMV identifies this corridor as a high priority

Existing Conditions: MIDDLEFIELD RD



- Moffett to Whisman
 - Speed limit: 35 mph
 - Part-time bike lanes
 - On-street parking
 - Weekday evenings, all day weekends

- Whisman to Bernardo
 - Speed limit: 35 mph
 - Bike Lanes
 - No parking







EXISTING CONDITIONS: MOFFETT BLVD



- Middlefield to SR 85
 - Speed limit: 40 mph
 - No bike lanes
 - Parking allowed
 - Sidewalks



- SR 85 to Clark
 - Speed limit: 40 mph
 - Bike lanes + narrow overpasses
 - No parking
 - Sidewalk gap near Leong






MIDDLEFIELD ROAD

- Moffett to Whisman
 - Some on-street parking noted
 - One parking issue at a residential address (side street available)
- Whisman to Bernardo
 - No parking

MOFFETT BOULEVARD

- Middlefield to SR 85
 - Limited on-street parking noted, formal survey not yet conducted
- SR 85 to Clark
 - No parking

Possible Streetscapes



- Four basic alternatives for Moffett and/or Middlefield
- Earliest stage of the projects
- Not all parts of the road are equal
- There are many factors to consider
- Looking for community input
- No guarantee of the final design

Protected Bikeway with Trees and Groundcovers












ALTERNATIVE A: RESTRIPE EXISTING CONDITIONS

- Restriping part-time bike lanes
- Existing parking conditions
- No transportation device or e-scooter on Moffett from Middlefield to SR 85







ALTERNATIVE B: PROTECTED BIKEWAY WITH FLEXIBLE POSTS



- Protected bikeways with some bike lane segments (narrow sections)
- Restricts parking
- Not a continuous feature (10 to 20 foot spacing of posts)

ALTERNATIVE C: PROTECTED BIKEWAY WITH CONCRETE MEDIANS



- Protected bikeways with some bike lane segments (narrow sections)
- Restricts parking

ALTERNATIVE D: PROTECTED BIKEWAY WITH TREES & GROUNDCOVERS



- Protected bikeway with some bike lane segments (narrow sections)
- Restricts parking
- More expensive vertical element, canopy and natural drainage

OTHER ISSUES TO BE CONSIDERED (BEYOND BIKEWAYS)



Resurfacing type

- Sidewalk treatments
 - Gap closure near Leong
 - Possible Sidewalk widening
- Bus stop accommodations
- Intersection treatments
 - High visibility crosswalks
 - Protected intersections (Middlefield at Moffett, Whisman, Ellis, Bernardo)




