

Introductory Remarks

- Improving road safety is a top priority for the City
- El Camino Real Working with Caltrans to add:
 - Protected bikeways for most segments between Sylvan Avenue and Rengstorff Avenue
 - Segments of Class II bikeways with green dashed paint at driveways and intersections
 - Curb ramp upgrades including bulb outs on unsignalized side streets
 - High visibility crosswalks at all signalized intersections
 - New pedestrian crossings at Pettis Avenue, Bonita Avenue, and Crestview Drive



Develop action plan with 7Es	Identify and prioritize countermeasures










Mountain View had 1,242 crashes from 2014-2019, including 13 fatal and 64 severe injury crashes






Pedestrians and bicyclists are over-represented among fatal and severe injury crashes






73% of KSI crashes occur on 35+ mph streets






50% of KSI crashes occur at intersections of 35 and 25 mph streets






Most fatal or severe injury crashes occurred at major intersections, which are signalized








Driver Turning Left, Pedestrian Crossing in Crosswalk




Driver Proceeding Straight, Pedestrian Crossing in Crosswalk







Potential Prioritization Criteria for LRSP

- Severity of Crashes
- Equity
 - Income
 - Vulnerable Road Users
- Proximity to Key Destination

- Proven Effectiveness
 - High-level cost/benefit analysis
- Implementation
 - Potential to Leverage Planned CIPs or Other Ongoing Efforts
 - Project Completion Timeframe
 - Degree of Agency Coordination
